Fibre broadband arrives for 15,000 homes and businesses

Reaching our first homes and businesses was marked with May Day celebrations in Alderley Edge, Weaverham and Westwood in Warrington as the first Connecting Cheshire areas were switched-on to fibre. More areas will follow as our first phase roll-out gathers pace.

Alan's Story – life in the fast lane!

Alan Barker of Warrington has recently upgraded to fibre. Here's his story: "Before fibre, we were achieving around 5Mbps, but at peak times connection speeds would drop to 2Mbps and below. Although we are a small family of 3, we still have 13 connected devices, some of which need regular software updates. Speeds are now mostly consistent at 60-70 Mbps and upload is consistent at around 18 Mbps. Even at peak times, where speeds do drop to around 50 Mbps, there is still enough bandwidth for multiple use of our connection. I work in IT and my job can entail downloading large images of 2-3GB in size. Previously that would be something I would not even attempt from home, but with fibre it's now a possibility. In fact, our fibre connection at home downloads files quicker than when I'm at the office! Overall, I am so glad we now have fibre. It was a long wait, with what seemed like most of the country getting fibre, and Warrington was being left out, but thanks to Connecting Cheshire and their campaigning, fibre is now a reality."

Connect

You can use Skype to talk with up to 25 other people for free on one call, as long as everyone's on Skype. To initiate a Skype group call, you simply create a group with everyone you want in it and hit the call button.
